Yet, Shad's founders saw beyond the classroom, envisioning a program where students didn't just learn about possibilities—they created them. Over time, this vision expanded as STEM evolved into STEAM, integrating the arts to foster creativity and innovation, reinforcing the idea that true problem-solving thrives at the intersection of disciplines.

Today, Shad thrives as a cornerstone of innovation, operating on 30 post-secondary campuses across Canada and inspiring over 24,000 alumni who are shaping industries, communities, and futures. From its earliest days as "Shad Valley" to its evolution as Shad Canada, this program has proven that learning isn't just about theories—it's about doing. Students dive into experiential projects, solve pressing challenges, and build resilience, all while connecting with peers and mentors who share their passion for making a difference.

Shad has been igniting the potential of Canada's brightest young minds, empowering them to meaningfully lead and innovate for more than four decades. With over 24,000 alumni to date, the program's impact speaks for itself—93% of students surveyed rave about their experience and would recommend it to others. Every year, Shad brings together extraordinary grade 10 and 11 students from across the country, reflecting the diversity of perspectives, interests and strengths of youth from across Canada. The competitive selection process means that cohorts are filled with curious, driven, and creative thinkers ready to make their mark in fields like technology, medicine, education, and clean energy.

Shad alumni don't just excel—they thrive. Equipped with critical skills like problem-solving, effective communication, and leadership, these changemakers pursue careers and post-secondary paths that shape industries and communities. An impressive 91% of participants say Shad improved their critical thinking, and 90% report feeling more confident in their ability to collaborate and communicate. Even during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, Shad's online programs stood out as engaging and impactful, proving its adaptability and unwavering commitment to excellence.

What truly sets Shad apart is its emphasis on community and collaboration. Students dive into design projects and activities that bring diverse perspectives together, fostering a culture of inclusion and mutual respect. These experiences create lasting bonds and prepare participants to tackle real-world challenges with creativity and confidence. By uniting young leaders from coast to coast, Shad strengthens Canada's social and economic fabric, ensuring that the next generation is equipped to drive progress, innovation, and positive change. Shad and Inclusivity: Embracing Diversity, Empowering Minds

At Shad, community is the foundation of everything we do. We believe exceptional young minds exist everywhere, and it's our mission to discover and empower them. And we do.

Shad brings together students from across Canada, blending rural and urban perspectives, diverse backgrounds, and unique life experiences. Each campus is a space filled with diverse ideas and perspectives challenging youth to embrace and learn from others while exploring different ways of thinking. These powerful connections foster collaboration, inclusivity, and a sense of belonging that extends far beyond the program, and inspires youth to grow into thoughtful leaders.

We are purposeful in reaching youth in underrepresented communities, including Black, Indigenous, 2SLGBTQI+ communities, and students with disabilities, ensuring that every voice and perspective is valued.

Shad partners with Pathways to Education, Black Boys Code, and other STEAM organizations serving youth, as well as collaborates with educators and guidance counselors to reach students from all corners of Canada. With over \$5 million in annual bursaries and scholarships funded by generous donors, financial barriers are dismantled, giving talented young Canadians the chance to pursue their goals and meet their potential.

"Our school is an isolated, northern Indigenous school and opportunities to meet with and work with students of like interests are not readily available. At Shad, our students were able to build their self-confidence and feel like they belonged. The chance to see new places and have new experiences was invaluable. In the summer of 2024, Raina attended Shad's live-in program at the University of Lethbridge in Alberta. Entering the program as a grade 11 student, she embraced the opportunity to explore her interests in STEAM.

Reflecting on her Shad experience, Raina shared that it taught her the importance of authenticity and openness to new experiences. "Normally I try to change my personality to fit others around me, but at Shad I realized that acting like myself will connect me with great people," she said. This realization led her to form meaningful connections and seize new opportunities within the program.

Looking ahead, Raina plans to leverage her passion for STEAM to make a positive impact in the medical field. She aspires to inspire and create opportunities for women and young Indigenous girls in STEAM, embodying Shad's commitment to social innovation.

To future Shad participants, Raina advises: "Talk to as many people as possible because no one there will judge you... open up to people and make as many connections as early as you can." Her experience underscores the supportive and inclusive environment that Shad fosters, empowering students to be themselves and pursue their passions.

Shad not only introduced him to his wife, Karen, but also helped his son, Isaac, find his academic stride and explore his passion for engineering and entrepreneurship. Aaron reflects on how Shad taught him valuable lessons in problem-solving, teamwork, and integrating feedback from peers, which are critical skills for navigating complex challenges in the real world.

"It's an opportunity in a fairly short period of time that can have such a huge impact on every student and can really change their perspective in a way that you don't get from other programs. When you see what these kids go on to do you just can't ask for better proof of the value."

In 1991, Aaron attended Shad at the University of Calgary during the first technology boom of the 1990s. The program helped him realize his potential and broadened his career aspirations. After Shad, he pursued a degree in Biology at Queen's University, followed by work in the sciences and later an MBA from Western Ontario's Ivey School of Business. Aaron's professional journey led him to become the Chief Investment Officer for University Pension Plan Ontario.

Aaron also credits Shad for bringing him and Karen together, an event that has shaped each of their lives in the most meaningful way. In 2023, their son Isaac attended Shad and showed a growth in focus and ambition that Aaron knows will serve him well as he moves along his academic and career path. Motivated by the program's impact on his family, Aaron believes in supporting Shad to help other students reach their full potential. He views it as an essential investment in Canada's future, offering young people a unique and transformative experience that shapes their personal and professional development.



Breaking Financial Barriers: Ensuring Access for All

At Shad, we believe that financial barriers should never stand in the way of a love of learning. Donor support ensures that the program is not just for the few who can afford it—but empowers students from rural and remote communities, low income communities and underrepresented communities to take their place among Canada's next generation of changemakers.

Shad must raise over \$5 million annually to help offset program fees and provide targeted bursaries and scholarships. More than 30% of participants receive targeted financial assistance ensuring that financial barriers do not prevent participation. As we continue to expand, the need for fundraising will grow accordingly.

These funds enable youth to focus on learning, connecting, and growing. The impact is profound—not only for the participants themselves but for the broader communities and industries they will one day serve. By investing in access and opportunities for students, donors help Shad foster an ecosystem where diverse perspectives lead to stronger solutions and students reaching their full potential.

Shad participants receive \$5 million of fee assistance each year.

Shad Alum Parent Donor Meghan Sharir and her family know firsthand the impact of Shad on the lives of students and the ways their donation to the program will provide life-changing opportunities to deserving Canadian youths.

"One of the most impactful parts of the program for our daughter was the kids she met from all corners of the country. She made so many great friendships with students who were at Shad on a scholarship and who shared with Zoe how much it meant for them to be there. So, we know from firsthand account the concrete

impact our donation is having on a student's life, it feels very personal."

Meghan Sharir describes her daughter Zoe's experience with the Shad program as "transformational." Seeing the lasting impact of Shad on her daughter, Meghan and her family decided to donate to the program to help other students access the same life-changing experience. The Sharir family have been impressed by Shad's commitment to access, ensuring students from all backgrounds have the opportunity to grow and explore post-secondary

education and meet their potential.

Meghan believes that supporting young, ambitious students is one of the most impactful ways to drive positive change for the future.

"If there's anything, any small thing that we can do to help a student who deserves an opportunity, it's hard to think of a better way to do that than giving to Shad. Our experience tells us that our donation will give at least one kid an experience that hopefully will open up a door in some way that wouldn't have happened otherwise."

Shad Alum, Natalie Mitchell, turned the passion for using STEAM for social good she cultivated at Shad into an award-winning community project called **Tech for Community** that adapts generic children's toys into ones that can be used by children with disabilities.

At Shad's University of Western Ontario campus, Natalie not only gained valuable technical and career skills, but also gained the confidence needed to put those skills into practice making an impact in the world. Following her time in the program, she saw a need in her community and an opportunity to put what she'd learned at Shad into practice. She began adapting toys for children with special needs by modifying their circuits and creating larger buttons using a 3D printer, which she offered by request to parents of children with special needs. Following its initial success, the project has expanded to include other volunteers who help with toy adaptations and school workshops, where students learn how to modify toys for the project and build empathy for peers with disabilities to encourage them to continue their own community giving. "I would have never been able to do what I've done with the project if I didn't learn the skills that I learned at Shad, if I didn't gain the confidence I did, and if I didn't meet the people that I met. It really was a life-changing experience," shared Natalie.

Natalie was awarded the Ingenious+ National Award for her **Tech for** Community project, which provided \$10,000 in funding and has enabled Natalie to further grow her project and widen her positive impact on some of Canada's most vulnerable.

Joshua Liu Shad2005, Founder

When Josh entered the Shad program in 2005, he already knew he loved STEAM exploration. What he discovered was how this passion could be combined with entrepreneurship to solve real world challenges affecting everyday Canadians.

At Shad's McMaster University campus, Josh was introduced to inspiring mentors and field experts who showed him how to bring an innovative idea into fruition by tapping the resources around him and building a business plan that can inspire others to embrace his vision.

These lessons proved vital when, following his start at medical school, Josh realized his interest lay in solving systemic issues rather than pursuing a specialty and he began exploring ways to improve patient outcomes, such as reducing hospital readmissions. His entrepreneurial spirit, nurtured during his time at Shad, led him to create SeamlessMD, a platform that connects patients with healthcare providers throughout their entire journey, from pre-surgery to post-surgery recovery. "Shad gave me a taste for the excitement of starting a business. You had to learn about products and draft the financial reports and format a business plan, learn about manufacturing... it set me up for putting the two together in creating SeamlessMD."

SeamlessMD uses technology to engage, monitor, and provide real-time support to patients via smartphones, tablets, or computers. This innovative platform is currently used by doctors and hospitals in almost all provinces across Canada and has proven successful in reducing readmissions, emergency visits, and overall healthcare costs, while improving patient care. By combining his medical expertise with the engineering skills of his co-founders, Joshua channelled the lessons and skills he gained at Shad, using tech to transform healthcare delivery.

Scott Malcom

Shad1993, Surgeon General

When Shad alum Brigadier-General Scott Malcolm, Canada's Surgeon General, spoke to Shads in the summer of 2024, he shared valuable lessons on leadership, personal growth, and overcoming challenges that he gained during his own Shad experience, lessons that have continued to meaningfully inform his personal and professional life since. "Shad really set the stage for me... you have to trust yourself and the people around you, understanding that it comes down to teamwork."

As a young student from a small town in Cape Breton, Scott never imagined the professional heights he'd reach when he arrived at Shad's Acadia University campus in the summer of 1993. But the mentorship and demonstrations of good leadership Scott experienced at Shad played a pivotal role in his development. Those positive influences underpinned his pursuit of an undergraduate degree at Harvard University, followed by medical school at Dalhousie University and his enrollment in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF), where he rose through the ranks and managed medical teams during critical deployments in Bosnia, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, as well as during the COVID-19 pandemic. His exceptional work and leadership led to him being elevated to the role of Surgeon General, the professional head of the Canadian military health jurisdiction and head of the Royal Canadian Medical Service.

Scott's leadership philosophy stresses the importance of teamwork and innovation, core values he experienced at Shad. Acting as a mentor to current Shads, Scott uses his own experiences to encourage young leaders to trust in their abilities, work collaboratively, and rise to challenges with an open mind and resilience.

The National Research Council of Canada (NRC) plays a meaningful role as a donor and supporter of Shad, aligning with its mission to foster innovation and develop Canada's future in science and technology. The relationship is rooted in a shared vision: nurturing youth through STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) education and empowering them to pursue impactful careers in research and innovation.

"I'm not aware of a lot of other programs in Canada that do what Shad does," said Matteo Bernabo, a Science Policy Fellow at the NRC. "Shad is the next level as a national program at university campuses, engaging students in real research with professionals affiliated with university research centers."

Through both financial support and active engagement, NRC contributes to Shad by:

- Providing expert researchers to deliver lectures and workshops across Shad campuses.
- Participating in program elements like the Design Challenge, where NRC professionals support students tackling real-world problems.
- Fostering a culture of curiosity and innovation, directly engaging with youth during a formative stage in their development.

According to Matteo Bernabo from the NRC, Shad attracts highly motivated students, making it an ideal investment for NRC's talent development goals. The NRC's involvement is seen not just as a donation, but as a strategic partnership aimed at growing Canada's scientific and technological capacity.

The NRC and Shad relationship is collaborative, mission-driven, and mutually beneficial, with NRC investing time, resources, and expertise to cultivate a future generation of innovators aligned with national priorities.
